### **DISTRICT FINANCIAL NEWS**

The Board will again be discussing the placement of an emergency levy renewal on the ballot for the public's consideration in the fall of 2024. If approved, the proposed emergency levy renewal would be for a period of five years to produce the annual amount of \$400,000, which would result in a continuation of the current operating levy. The funds generated by the emergency levy renewal would be used to cover operating costs of the district.

The information being provided is merely factual, district personnel are not allowed to advocate for or against the passage of the levy or bond issue during times they are being compensated by the district.
