DISTRICT FINANCIAL NEWS

At its May 14, 2025 meeting, the Bristol Local School District Board of Education will consider whether to place a permanent improvement renewal levy on the November 2025 ballot for the public's consideration. The permanent improvement levy renewal being considered would be for a period of five years, and, if approved, would produce an approximate annual amount of \$130,000, representing continuation of existing levy funding. If approved, funds generated from the permanent improvement renewal levy would be used to pay for permanent improvements to school buildings, improvements to the school site and the purchase of buses for the district. The information being provided is merely factual. District personnel are not allowed to advocate for or against the passage of a levy or bond issue during times they are being compensated by the
